Lee's Summit woman collects 'items of dignity' for shelters

The goal for the third annual Giving Hope and Help Feminine Hygiene Product Drive is simple: To nearly triple its collection from last year.

After collecting more than 5,000 sanitary napkins and tampons in its first year, and more than 11,000 last year, Giving Hope and Help founder Jessica McClellan is ambitious for the latest drive, set for 1 p.m. to 6 p.m. Dec. 12 at the Promise Weeding and Event Space in Kansas City.

The drive will benefit domestic violence survivors that reside at four local domestic violence shelters, including Hope House's locations in Independence and Lee's Summit, and Safe Home and Newhouse shelters.

"We want to collect 30,000 products," McClellan, a Lee's Summit resident, said. "Sanitary napkins and tampons are the two least donated items to places of refuge across the country and globe. We call these 'items of dignity."

Dan Ryan, vice president for development at Safe Home, said the importance of the drive and the community's involvement is even greater than one might think.

"Many of our clients come in with nothing, and have been the victim of financial abuse as well as physical abuse," he said. "Even if they do happen to have some resources, they are often not in a position to drop by the local store to pick up necessities."

Hope House CEO MaryAnne Metheny said the drive helps supply up to six-months' worth of feminine hygiene needs for the organization.

"Community involvement is crucial," Metheny said. "If we didn't have the support during the drive, we'd have to use other funds to support these basic needs rather than providing a therapeutic service to a domestic violence survivor."


